UPDATE YOUR VOTER INFORMATION ONLINE AND CONSIDER VOTING BY MAIL

The Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections, Wendy Sartory Link, is asking everyone, while spending extra time at home, to take advantage of the many services provided on the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections website and consider requesting a **Vote-by-Mail** ballot for the upcoming elections.

"As the coronavirus concerns continue to grow, voting by mail is the safest and most convenient way that a voter can cast their vote. In Palm Beach County, 41% of the votes cast in March were by Vote-by-Mail ballots, and I anticipate that number will increase for the August and November elections," said Supervisor Link.

Advantages of requesting a Vote-by-Mail ballot

- ✓ Have the option to vote from home
- ✓ Take time making your decisions
- ✓ Mail your ballot back in its pre-paid return envelope or drop it off in a secure drop box

Many voter services are available online and it's very important that voters keep their voter registration information up to date, including their signature. Residents can register to vote, download and print a registration form to update their signature, request a Vote-by-Mail ballot, update their address or change their party affiliation, all from the comfort of their own home by using our website pbcelections.org.

The SOE office is looking ahead and preparing for the August Primary and the November General Elections.

Primary Election - August 18, 2020

Voter Registration/Party Change Deadline - July 20, 2020 DEADLINE to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot – 5:00 PM on August 8, 2020

General Election - November 3, 2020

Voter Registration Deadline- October 5, 2020

DEADLINE to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot – 5:00 PM on October 24, 2020

Request your Vote-by-Mail ballot now and be ready for the 2020 elections.
